TWIDDLEMITTS....



....are a knitted or crocheted tube with items attached that a patient with dementia can twiddle with their hands. People with dementia often have restless hands and like to have something to keep their hands occupied. It provides a wonderful source of visual, tactile and sensory stimulation. Early use has shown them to be hugely successful and impacting very positively on a patient's hospital stay.

We need volunteer patients, staff and visitors, to help create more Twiddlemitts. The basic mitt is embellished with buttons, bells, beads, and toggles – anything that can be sewn onto the mitt as well as a variety of textured fabrics, such as ribbon, crocheted flowers and pockets. These items are sewn on the inside as well as the outside of each mitt.
