Improvement Fundamentals Course – An Introduction to Spreading Improvement Gains

The fourth course in the <u>Improvement Fundamentals programme</u> – Course 401 – covers the important topic of how to spread your quality improvements beyond your immediate workplace. Taking this course will help you to:

- 1. describe what spread means and why it's important
- 2. develop strategies to spread your successful interventions throughout your organisation and region
- 3. describe how to improve engagement with your stakeholders in your own improvement work
- 4. most importantly, complete a spread plan.

The course is made up of five 30-minute modules. Each module contains an activity at the end that you need to complete in order to complete the course overall.

You don't have to have completed any of the previous courses to participate

The West of England Academic Health Science Network's Health Innovation Programme (HIP) is **open for applications until 28 January**. The programme is aimed at "people working in the West of England with innovative business propositions that have real potential for health and care." For further information <u>click here</u>

Funding Opportunity: Improve analytical capability in health & care services

The Health Foundation, an independent charity committed to bringing about better health and health care for people in the UK, has launched the third round of its Advancing Applied Analytics programme. They are looking to support analysts who are working on local innovative and ambitious projects that can demonstrate how they will improve analytical capability in support of health and care services.

They have £750,000 of funding to support up to 12 good quality projects across the UK that:

- improve analytical capability and can show how this will support better care in the future
- are led by a local/regional NHS or social care provider or commissioning organisation including local authorities, though partnerships with other groups and sectors are welcome
- could benefit from funding of up to a maximum of £75,000 per project
- start no later than September 2019 for a maximum duration of 15 months.

The deadline for applications is noon, Tuesday 26 February 2019.
