Improvement Fundamentals Course – An Introduction to Spreading Improvement Gains

The fourth course in the <u>Improvement Fundamentals programme</u> – Course 401 – covers the important topic of how to spread your quality improvements beyond your immediate workplace. Taking this course will help you to:

- 1. describe what spread means and why it's important
- 2. develop strategies to spread your successful interventions throughout your organisation and region
- describe how to improve engagement with your stakeholders in your own improvement work

4. most importantly, complete a spread plan.

The course is made up of five 30-minute modules. Each module contains an activity at the end that you need to complete in order to complete the course overall.

You don't have to have completed any of the previous courses to participate in Course 401 – you just need to have an idea of a project you would like to work on.

GSQIA Gold Improvement Coach Programme

The GSQIA Gold Coaching Quality Improvement programme is designed to develop a network of staff across the Trust with a combination of QI and coaching skills who can help to embed and support local Quality Improvement Activities – making a real difference for our patients. Developing Specialty-led Quality Management is one of the three main elements of the new Quality Framework, allowing Specialties to identify 'what is important for your patients' and then deliver Quality Improvements in those areas.

The role of the Gold QI Coach will help to support Improvers at a local level to help ensure the success of their Improvement work. The role will also work within the Specialty to ensure that the improvement efforts are focused on the areas that are most needed so that limited resource is appropriately directed.
