- Identification of QI training need in the area and commitment for attendance
- A link into Specialty and Divisional processes and structures for sharing, learning, scale up and spread.
- Documented allocation of QI / Audit / Governance leads with multidisciplinary representation
- Identification, support and maintenance of Gold Coaches within the area and support of Gold coaches to supervise projects
- A commitment to Continuous Improvement
